7. Palaeolithic Period

**8.** People were hunter gatherers and they lived in caves, tepees or simple huts. They cooked their prey, including woolly mammoths using fire.



9. Mesolithic Period

**10.** People began to settle into farming villages instead of moving from place to place.  
**11.** People started to look after animals and grow their own crops.

12. Neolithic Period

**13.** People changed from being hunter/gatherers to farming.  
**14.** Tools were developed to become smaller and finer.

19. River Thames in Greater London

**20.** The oldest skull was found on the banks of The Thames in 2019. It was 5,600 years old.



15. Skara Brae - Orkney

**16.** Skara Brae is a stone-built Neolithic settlement. It is a cluster of 8 houses which were occupied between 3,000 & 2500 BC.



17. Stone Henge - Wiltshire

**18.** Stone Henge is a prehistoric monument. It is a ring of standing stones.
